English Teaching


• We are not suggesting that any of the skills are taught or learned in isolation.

Moving about

Approaches to Reading


- Phonics (phonic book) (the text)

 - The type of reading is often based on a picture. (the text)
 - Reading familiar nursery rhymes or songs
